Service Review Team (SRT) brings youth services, social services, school personnel, community providers together with families and natural supports to assist families who are struggling with behavioral or emotional issues. The SRT team works with families to identify resources, provide recommendations, and make referrals for services. This service is free and confidential.

<u>Counseling, Advocacy & Referrals:</u> Cromwell Youth Services provides support for young people and their families facing a variety of issues and obstacles. We're here to listen and provide referrals.

Cromwell's Restorative Youth Diversion (CRYD) is Cromwell's Juvenile Review Board (JRB) and is a positive alternative to the juvenile justice system. CRYD operates from a restorative framework and according to standards set by the Connecticut Youth Services Association. The CRYD team is made up of local professionals and community stakeholders that work collaboratively with youth and their families to repair the harm done to relationships and the community by an incident that resulted in a court summons/misdemeanor arrest.

KIN CARE CONNECTION



The Cromwell Kin Care Group is a place for caregivers raising a relative's child(ren) to gather, network, and support one another. This group offers a place to share the challenges and joys of parenting a loved one while gaining valuable community resources and information. Meetings will provide Kin Caregivers with presentations, guest speakers, and topics of discussion to assist them during their child's adolescence. Meetings are the second Tuesday of each month.
